

GREEK HOUSING – LIFE SAFETY INSPECTION

EXPLANATION SHEET

In order for a chapter to pass ONU's Greek Housing – Life Safety Inspection, **EACH** section of the inspection form must meet the criteria with a passing score.

ONU will inspect the Greek Housing Facilities during fall and spring semesters. For houses open during the summer, a third inspection will occur during that time.

The first failed inspection will result in the following actions:

- 1) A warning letter will be issued to chapters failing to meet passing criteria.
- 2) Chapters must submit a detailed, line-item description (based on the inspection form) of each failed area indicating a plan-of-action for correction by the next inspection.
- 3) If the needed repairs are major or extensive, a chapter can request that a 'time extension' be granted for the specific area. The time extension allows chapters to work on the deficient area without failing the same section with each inspection. Time extensions for needed repairs will be evaluated by the Life Safety Committee on an individual basis.

The second successive failed inspection will result in the following actions:

- 1) Prohibition of all 'chapter-house social events' until the identified facility problems are corrected (as determined by the Life Safety Committee).
- 2) Chapters will be required to attend a Life Safety Program (90% of members must attend).
- 3) The Chapter's National Office will be notified of the inspection results.

The third consecutive failed inspection could result in the following actions:

- 1) Recommendation to close the facility to the University Vice Presidents.
- 2) State inspections of the facility.

Inspection results will be available within two (2) weeks of the facility inspection from the Director of Student Involvement.

Any documentation that needs to be submitted (anything not turned-in at the time of the inspection) is due within 3 weeks of the receiving the inspection results.
