OhioLINK Expands

Although OhioLINK has 85 Ohio Colleges and universities as members, it is always looking for additional resources for students and faculty. A new initiative is underway to allow OhioLINK patrons to borrow materials from the state's major public libraries. As a trial, some 600,000 items from the Cuyahoga County Public Library now appear in the OhioLINK central catalog and many can be borrowed online. Databases

Proquest Nursing Journals

In preparation for the BS in Nursing program, a new database targeting that discipline has been added. Proquest Nursing covers more than 270 nursing and related journals from 1988 – present. Many of the articles cited are available online as full-text.

Naxos Music Library

Naxos Music Library is a comprehensive collection of classical music available online. It includes the complete *Naxos*, *Marco Polo* and *Dacapo* catalogues of over 85,000 tracks, including Classical music, Jazz, World, Folk and Chinese music. Notes on the works being played are available as well as biographical information on composers or artists in Naxos's extensive database.

ERIC Documents Now Online

On October 1, 2004, the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) began offering free, full-text, non-journal ERIC resources. These materials include more than 107,000 full-text documents which were previously available through fee-based services only.

OhioLINK's has linked to these documents and now provides direct access to the full-text ERIC document from the citation in the [ERIC database](#). OhioLINK users can find links to these ERIC documents, or any other full text, by clicking on the "Find a Copy" link, or the OLinks icon from the search results screen of the ERIC database.

The full-text is only available for ERIC documents with dates of 1993 or later. New ERIC documents produced from now on will be only in electronic format. ERIC. Many earlier documents are available on microfiche. Check ONU's POLAR catalog to see if a copy is available locally or request a copy via [interlibrary loan](#).

Oxford Reference Online

Last year's subscription to Oxford Reference Online has been their "premium collection" that covers more than 100 high-quality online reference works in the Oxford Companions series plus the Oxford Dictionary of Quotations. These works can be searched individually or as a collection.



Anthropology Plus

Two databases, Anthropological Index and Anthropological Literature have been combined to form a new resource, Anthropology Plus.

As far as can be determined at present, no content has been lost in the switch.

Improvements to Classical Music Library

At the end of July [Classical Music Library](#) (CML) announced that the following music publishers would contribute content to the Library.

- ? **MODE:** Bringing a contemporary focus with artists such as Ensemble 21 and the Arditti Quartet, MODE also offers significant composers such as Cage, Xenakis, Sclesi and Feldma.
- ? **LSO Live:** Launched in 2000, the LSO Live label quickly established a fine reputation for a catalogue based around the Romantic orchestral repertoire. Particular highlights are Sir Colin Davis' influential revival of Berlioz, including his recording of the opera Les Troyens, which won Best ClassicalRecord and Best Opera at the 2002 Grammy awards.
- ? **LYRICHORD:** The Lyrichord label covers a number of specialist areas within the Early and Baroque repertoire; including, medieval vocal polyphony, the keyboard works of Rameau, Handel and Scarlatti, recordings of the great organs of Europe and songs of English masters, such as William Byrd and John Dowland.
- ? **NUOVA ERA:** Turin-based label Nuova Era focuses primarily on Italian repertoire from Paisiello to Gian Carlo Menotti. They have a wide range of lesser-known operas from Bellini, Rossini, Donizetti and their contemporaries, as well as favorites such as The Barber of Seville. Prominent singers on Nuova Era include Maria Callas in Lucia di Lammermoor.
- ? **ASV:** ASV has become a respected label for its high-quality recordings of the classical repertoire. Ranging from superb performances of mainstream works to more unusual repertoire, much of it unavailable elsewhere.
- ? **BLACK BOX:** Black Box represents the cutting edge in contemporary music recording. Specializing in 20th and 21st century repertoire, it includes the works of Birtwistle, Nyman and James MacMillan, featuring artists such as Raphael Wallfisch, Evelyn Glennie, John Harle and the Nash Ensemble.

These additions bring CML's content partners to 32 labels, expanding CML's database to over 35, 000 tracks. This material is available to ONU students and faculty.

Lexis-Nexis Congressional Upgrade

Statutes at Large "...the official compilation of public and private laws printed by the Government Printing Office. The Statutes At Large is printed annually and the laws within it are arranged by order of passage" has been added to Lexis-Nexis Congressional Universe. As OhioLINK's description of this collection of electronic texts notes:

History E-Book Project contains almost 800 electronic books of high quality in the field of history. These are works of major importance to historical studies, books that remain vital to both scholars and advanced students and are frequently cited in the literature. Over the next few years, the History E-Book Project plans to add approximately 250 books annually to the collection, as well as 85 new electronic titles.
