Methodological notes:

The poll was conducted between 4/5/19, and 4/10/19, among adults 18 years and older in Ohio, and registered to vote (n = 1505), by Professor Robert Alexander in conjunction with honor students from Ohio Northern University. The margin is error (MOE) is $\pm 2.7\%$. The margin of error was calculated for answers throughout the survey. While some answers have a lower MOE, no question had a higher MOE than $\pm 2.7\%$

Professor Alexander and the students developed questions and discussed question order to avoid response bias. The survey was modeled after questions asked in national surveys conducted by organizations such as Gallup, Pew, and the Washington Post.

Survey respondents were drawn from online panels (via Qualtrics) organized and curated by Dynata. To qualify for the survey, respondents had to be age 18 or older, live in Ohio, and identify the county in which they live. To overcome some of the limitations associated with online surveys, we utilized quotas for gender (51% female) and age (18-29 = 14%, 30-44 = 25%, 45-64 = 38%, 65+ = 23%) based on data from the 2018 American Community Survey (ACS) for Ohio.

Response order effects: To prevent response order effects, which can occur if respondents are more likely to choose the first response option in a survey, answers were randomized for several questions (available upon request).
